

Do I need special training on using the ESL FE2024 Kognity platform?

I love assigning Kognity as home extension work, but how do I know if my students are doing the reading?


Assigning Kognity reading to augment your in class discussion is key to their understanding! By viewing your Insights tab you can see which students "opened" the text, when they opened it and which sections they have viewed. In order for your students to get "credit" for completing the section reading, they must check "complete section" at the end of each reading, and complete all the activities and comprehension questions throughout the section.







What's the content ratio of the four skills (Reading, Listening, Writing, Speaking) in the book?







When should I start with the Exam Style Questions assignments?

Each subtopic in the book focuses on each of the questions that a student would expect in the exam. Additionally, the level of difficulty progresses as the subtopics progress, so ESQ 1.1 (for example) can be done right after completing subtopic 1.1 and so on.





Is there a way I can keep track of my student's work and progress?

Yes! In order to keep tabs on your students' work within the text, you can click "Insights" from the main home screen of each corresponding section. This "Questions tab" is extremely useful for keeping track of student engagement as well as formative assessment! This allows you to see student performance on all the questions they've taken in the book. The "Textbook tab" allows you to keep track of their reading progress.
