


IBDP English B Teacher to Teacher Tips

What kind of differentiation is there for students with different language skills?

Assignments in the Kognity platform can be issued to different students allowing them to work according to their capacity. For example, in Reading/Listening sections there might be an introductory vocabulary activity, this might be skipped in the case of stronger students.



An additional opportunity for differentiation is the "Reflection" sections, which offer students the opportunity to engage with the content in a different manner, through discussion, visual thinking strategies or extra information that might spark their curiosity.
